

International Urogynecology Journal Editor-in-Chief

The *International Urogynecology Journal (IUJ)*, the official journal of the International Urogynecological Association (IUGA), is currently accepting applications for the position of Editor(s)-in-Chief. The *IUJ* is an international, clinically-oriented subspecialty journal which currently receives approximately 800 submissions per year, and has an impact factor of **2.894 (2020 Journal Citation Reports®)**. It is owned by IUGA and published by Springer Nature Publishing Company. The Editor(s)-in-Chief provides leadership for the journal and is responsible for the overall functioning and success of the *IUJ*. The Editor(s)-in-Chief lead a team of nine Editors, a Fellows Editor, and a Social Media Editor who are responsible for managing peer review of journal submissions and making editorial decisions using the Editorial Manager online submission platform, plus a larger Editorial Board.

Responsibilities

- Set overall strategy for editorial content of the journal;
- Recruit and review submissions to the journal and balance submission assignments among Editors. The Editor(s)-in-Chief delegates assignments to Editors and ensures that peer-review/editorial decisions are fair, timely, and meet the *IUJ*'s high scientific and ethical standards;
- Work with Publisher to ensure the *IUJ*'s strategic and financial goals are being met;
- Contribute to journal content by drafting announcements and editorials, as needed;
- Work with IUGA Leadership;
- Uphold the ethics policies of the journal, review author appeals, and make determinations to ensure that ethical violations are not taking place;
- Work with production team to set issue lineup;
- Oversee the day-to-day operations of the Editorial Office;
- Provide leadership in Editor and Editorial Board selection and evaluation;
- Conduct and attend meetings, including Editor and Editorial Board Meeting at the IUGA Annual Meeting and regular conference calls with Publisher, Editors, and Editorial Office;
- Act as ambassador to the author/editor/reviewer/scientific community.

Qualifications

- Previous experience as an Editor for a scientific journal
- Strong academic and clinical background
- Fluent in English
- Knowledge of the publishing process including copyright issues, journal printing, peer review process, ethical questions
- International academic connections and ability to contribute to the journal's international mission
- Knowledge of IUGA's mission and structure
- Strong leadership skills and ability to work with a diverse international group of authors, editors, reviewers, and scientists
- Commitment to the strategic goals/vision for the journal
- Ability to arbitrate conflicts and maintain an unbiased stance in approaching conflicts
- Current membership in IUGA

Compensation

The Editor(s)-in-Chief will receive an annual stipend as well as complimentary registration and travel for the IUGA Annual Meeting.

Term of Service

The Editor(s)-in-Chief will be offered a fixed term of three years, renewable once.
