IUGA REGIONAL SYMPOSIUM, Singapore

27 – 29 April 2012 National University Hospital

FINAL REPORT

Background

The IUGA Regional Symposia is to provide educational opportunities to clinicians in various worldwide geographic locations regarding both basic and advanced urogynaecology, encourage exchange of knowledge and experiences regarding urogynaecology and identify specific areas of urogynaecologic educational needs specific to each region. The 3-day symposium reflects the educational needs of the local health care providers, related to gynaecology & obstetrics, urogynaecology, urology, colorectal surgery, gastroenterology and sexual dysfunction. Experts in these areas have been selected to be the international and local faculties for this educational event.

Location/Date/Local Host

Singapore was appointed as the location for the seventh Regional Symposium, representing the South-East Asian region. This 3-day programme includes a presymposium workshop followed by the symposia which were held from Friday April 27 to Sunday April 29, 2012. The local host was Dr Roy Ng from Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, National University Hospital, National University Health System.

Venue

The 3-day symposium was held in the Auditorium, National University Health System (NUHS Tower Block), National University Hospital, Singapore. Audiovisual was provided by the facility.

Language

The official language of the program was English. Translation was not provided.

Registration

There were a total of 139 registrants. Most of the registrations were done through the IUGA office via the online registration system. A few registrants had on-site registration. Registrants included 27 speakers (no charge), 2 moderators (no charge), 1 administrative person (no charge), 13 sonographers & pre-symposium workshop facilitators (no charge), 1 medical student (no charge), 44 residents/trainees/nurses (40% of registrants), 30 IUGA members and 13 non-members. Overall, 45% of the participants were from Singapore, 28% were from Indonesia while 27% were from Australia (n=1), Hong Kong (n=2), India (n=1), Philippines (n=6), Malaysia (n=12), Taiwan (n=4), Thailand (n=1) and Japan (n=2).

Registration fees were 75USD for Residents/Trainees/Nurses/Physiotherapists/NUHS staff, 150USD for IUGA members and 250USD for non-members. A Registration Desk was set up in the Foyer at the venue where all registrants checked in to collect the symposium material, which included programme booklet, symposium syllabus CD, name badge, evaluation form and Singapore guide donated by Singapore Tourism Board. The Registration Desk was manned by one IUGA administrator and 2 local secretarial assistants for the duration of the symposium.

Program and Lectures

The 3-day program commenced on Friday, 27 April 2012 at 07:45 with a NUH Grand Round Lecture by Prof Peter Dietz followed by a Presymposium Workshop, a Pre-symposium session and Opening Reception at 17:00; Saturday, 28 April 2012, lectures started at 08:30 and ended at 17:35; Sunday, 29 April 2012, lectures started at 08:30 with concluding remarks at 17:20 ending the symposium; lunch and coffee breaks were provided on all 3 days of the program.

The 20-30 mins lectures were presented by internationally renowned urogynaecologists and included Peter Dietz (Australia), Chris Maher (Australia), Helena Frawley (Australia), Mohamed Abdel Fattah (United Kingdom), Aruku Naidu (Malaysia), Khong Su Yen (Malaysia), Azmi Md Nor (Malaysia), Junizaf Zaidun (Indonesia), Suvit Bunyavejchevin (Thailand), Lisa Prodigalidad (Philippines), Lo Tsia Shu (Taiwan), Lan Zhu (China), Jimmy Nomura (Japan) and N Rajamaheswari (India). Local Singapore speakers included Arijit Biswas, Adaikan Ganesan, Aileen Seah, David Consigliere, K Rajendran, Ruben Wong, Yong Eu Leong, William Han How Chuan, Lee Lih Charn, Arthur Tseng, Chua Hong Liang, Christopher Chong, James Lee and Roy Ng who also served as the local host (see program).

Certificate

At the conclusion of the 3rd day, each participant received a certificate of attendance in exchange for their completed evaluation forms.

Educational Credits

The Singapore Medical Council approved 12 CME points to the whole symposium to local doctors (4 CME credits per day).

Syllabus

A Compact Disk containing the syllabus of proceedings was professionally recorded and provided to all attendees and speakers.

Course Evaluations

The evaluation forms were completed by 57.6% of participants (80/139). The majority of attendees were Urogynaecologist (36%). Overall, 42% rated the program was excellent and 55.5% rated good. 97.6% of participant rated the level of content as good to excellent and over 97.6% rated the speakers as good or excellent. The syllabus material, facility with respect to learning and quality of the AV were rated as good or excellent in 90.1%, 98.7%, and 98.7%, respectively. Overall organization was rated as excellent in 50% and good in 45%.

Informal Dinner

All regional and international speakers were invited to the Informal Dinners which were held on Thursday April 26 and Saturday April 28 in the evening. The dinner was held at Nasrin Ocean Persian & Seafood Cuisine which served Indian/ Persian cuisine and Straits Kitchen which served local cuisine.

Opening Reception

All of the symposium participants as well as the lecturers and organizers were invited to the opening ceremony, held on Friday April 27 in the evening at the Foyer of NUHS Tower Block in National University Hospital. Opening address was given by Dr Lisa Prodigalidad, IUGA International Board Representative and welcome addresses were given by both Professor Yong Eu Leong, the Head of Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, National University Hospital, and Dr Roy Ng, Senior Consultant of the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, National University Hospital (Local Chair). The opening ceremony was followed by a welcome reception serving local cuisine and wine.

Faculty Dinner

All speakers and administrative support were invited to the Faculty Dinner which was held on Friday April 27 in the evening after the Opening Reception. The dinner was held at Min Jiang Restaurant in Goodwood Park Hotel which served fine Sichuan cuisine.

Industry Support

There was no industry support to the symposium. The lunch and coffee breaks, informal dinners, opening reception and faculty dinner were sponsored by IUGA.

Future

The next Regional Symposium will be held in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia on November 28-29, 2012.
