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Preparatory Meeting

A preparatory meeting took place between the **IUGA** organising committee (Prof Paul Riss. Dr Hanzal, Miss Engelbert Ranee Thakar) and the local organisers (Dr M .B.Bellad & Prof B.R. Desai, Dr. R. B. Jawaharlal Nerli, Dr. B. R. Nilgar) in Nehru Medical College, Belgaum on the 13th and 14th January 2006. The ethos of the eXchange programme was introduced to the local committee.



The number of participants would be restricted to 40. Delegates would be invited from surrounding medical schools so that knowledge of urogynaecology acquired at this meeting would be widely disseminated. As urogynaecology is not a priority with health care in this part of the world, not much emphasis is paid to this subject during teaching and in clinical practice. The local organising committee therefore welcomed such an exchange programme. The scientific programme was discussed and finalised. The local and IUGA faculty was decided.

Report on the programme

The meeting took place on 3rd and 4th May 2006 in KLE Hospital. There was a lot of interaction between the delegates and the IUGA faculty during the meeting and in the breaks. This was particularly so during the workshops. The programme was designed to cover basics in urogynaecology.

Scientific programme

The programme consisted of 8 lectures, two panel discussions and five workshops and broadly covered most aspects of urogynaecology. The scientific programme is attached (Appendix 1).

Participants consisted of postgraduate students and consultants from various medical schools in Karnataka (Belgaum, Manipal, Tumkur and Manipal).

Venue



The lectures were held in the auditorium and workshops in 3 other rooms in K.L.E.S Hospital. This was kindly provided free of charge for the programme.

Summary of the meeting




The opening lecture was given by Dr Rajamaheshwari from Chennai. She authoritatively covered female health related issues in India with emphasis on incontinence and set the scene for the rest of the meeting. This was followed by a lecture on female sexual dysfunction by Miss Ranee Thakar. This subject is generally taboo in the Indian culture


and generated a lot of discussion. Mr Ash Monga covered efficacy of prolapse repair under local anaesthetic and Dr Willy Davila covered the recent trends in prolapse repair. Both lectures were well received. The following day, the opening lecture was on prevention of vault prolapse by Prof Paul Riss. Other topics included overactive bladder and stress incontinence and the concluding lecture was on surgical urinary fistula. Panel sessions focussed on childbirth trauma and incontinence. There were five workshops which generated extensive discussion and exchange of ideas.




Picture above shows the various workshops in progress

Comment on the evaluation process:

To allow comparison with the IUGA eXchange program in Johannesburg, South Africa 2005, we used the same questions in India. Unfortunately the design of the visual analogue scale (VAS) used to quantify was so different, that it appears unlikely that an adequate comparison can be drawn from the results:

This problem underscores how important it would be to find a standardized and reproducible instrument for measuring and evaluating our educational program.
